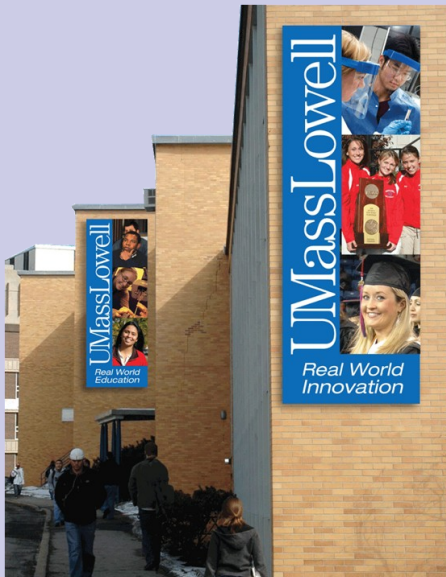




Graduate School of Education *Endowed Scholarships*

DOCTORAL SCHOLARSHIPS

M. Virginia Biggy

Established in 1989 in honor of the former Dean of the College of Education. Following Dr. Biggy's death in January 2006, it was decided to award a scholarship in her memory. Priority consideration is given to a doctoral student, enrolled in the Leadership in Schooling program, who has demonstrated the vision, capabilities and commitment to improve the quality of education for all children.



Zaher-Lacouture Family Scholarship

Recognizes the outstanding achievements of deserving doctoral candidates in the field of Education at UMass Lowell who are in the dissertation phase of their degree.



SCHOLARSHIPS - ALL DEGREE PROGRAMS

Mary Frances Hogan '26 Scholarship

Awards an annual scholarship to a worthy student matriculated into a graduate education degree program at UMass Lowell. Scholarship selection is based on academic record and commitment to teaching. Priority consideration given to teachers at, or graduates of, the Bartlett School in Lowell.

Ruth Walker Frank '28 Scholarship

Awarded to students enrolled in the Graduate School of Education and who demonstrate financial need through established federal financial aid formulas.

Mary, Joan and Nancy Scholarship for Courage and Compassion

This scholarship (endowed in 2011) is awarded to first-generation college students at UMass Lowell who aspire to become teachers.

ADVANCED M.Ed. and Ed.S. SCHOLARSHIPS

Catherine J. McArdle '35 Scholarship

The purpose of the Catherine J. McArdle '35 Endowed Scholarship Fund is to award scholarships for UMass Lowell students pursuing a degree at the Graduate School of Education studying for a Master's Degree in Education Administration with licensure as a school principal. This is the largest scholarship fund benefiting students studying at the Graduate School of Education.

Douglas and Mary Sullivan Scholarship

Awarded to students pursuing a Master's degree in Education Administration, Doctorate in Leadership in Schooling, or Ed.S. in Administration, Planning and Policy; exclusively for a school teacher or administrator in the Lowell Public School system. If no school teacher or administrator in Lowell Public Schools receives a scholarship in any given year, the income of the fund in said year shall revert to the principal.

Dr. Constance Lanseigne-Case Scholarship

Patricia Dyer McPhail '54 Scholarship

Preference is given to an outstanding student who is a resident of Lawrence or Haverhill, is enrolled in the Graduate School of Education at the University of Massachusetts Lowell, is pursuing a teaching career in elementary education, is the first generation in his/her family to attend college, and a student who demonstrates financial need through established federal financial aid formulas.

Loddy Weisberg '53 Memorial Scholarship

The scholarship is awarded to a student enrolled in the M.Ed. Initial Licensure Elementary program entering his/her practicum. The individual must have an outstanding academic record with a GPA of 3.5 or better and will complete a practicum in a Lowell public elementary school. Preference will be given to students from diverse backgrounds.

Murphy-Roberts-Murphy Scholarship

To receive and disburse funds for an endowed scholarship in education, preferably for elementary education majors, to alternate between students from Lawrence and Lowell.

FitzPatrick Family Scholarship

The FitzPatrick Family Education Scholarship is awarded to students selected by the Graduate School of Education Scholarship Committee, under the leadership of the Dean of the Graduate School of Education. Scholarship recipients must be enrolled in the "Fast Track to Teaching Program" in the Graduate School of Education at UMass Lowell. Recipients must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher and must be in good academic standing, must demonstrate financial need through established federal financial aid for-

Margaret Holland Barrett '58 Scholarship

To provide scholarship awards to students pursuing certification for a teaching career.

College of Education Alumni Centennial Scholarship

The purpose of this scholarship is to assist deserving students in furthering their education. Priority consideration is given to recent bachelor's degree recipients from UMass Lowell who have outstanding academic records, have financial need, and have been involved in community service.

Conlon-Drauch Family Scholarship

The Conlon-Drauch Family Scholarship is established in memory of Mary Conlon '27 and Mary Jo Drauch '59. The scholarship is intended for an aspiring teacher candidate who is matriculated into the masters in education degree program at the University of Massachusetts Lowell. Selection will be based on academic record, financial need, and

Philip F. Riley '86 Memorial Scholarship

The Philip F. Riley Scholarship is established in memory of a dedicated teacher and is intended for an aspiring teacher in the Graduate School of Education.

ELEMENTARY or SECONDARY EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS

E. Dewey and Rose A. Dyer Scholarship

The purpose of the Fund is to award scholarships for deserving UMass Lowell students enrolled in the Graduate School of Education. Preferences as to persons selected would be as follows: 1. First generation going to college. 2. Based on need. 3. From Greater Lawrence or Haverhill.

GSE Advisory Board

Established in 2009, the Advisory Board of the GSE supports a scholarship for a student with excellent academic credentials entering the M.Ed. Initial Licensure Program. Recipient must have completed their undergraduate degree at UMass Lowell.

Vito and Vasiliki (Ziogas) Selvaggio Scholarship

Established in 2003 to recognize outstanding graduates of UMass Lowell who have been admitted to a graduate program leading to education licensure. Priority consideration given to academic record, financial need, community service and interest in music or elementary education.

SECONDARY EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS

Nettie Ginsburg Altshuler Scholarship

Provides scholarships to eligible students majoring in Computer Science, English Literature, Music History, Literature, or Education; and intend to seek certification for a teaching career in one of those disciplines in either a primary or secondary school. Earn at least 1/3 of the credits required for a BA degree in Liberal Arts courses outside of the major field of study and distributed as evenly as feasible among three broad areas: fine arts, history, humanities and languages; the social and behavioral sciences; and the natural and physical sciences and mathematics. Be a full-time sophomore, junior, or senior student, and have attained a junior status not more than two years previously. GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.

Class of 1954 State Teacher's College

Scholarships awarded to students enrolled in the Graduate School of Education or to students enrolled in the College of Fine Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences, Music Teaching and/or Music Education programs. Students must be at their sophomore, junior or senior level, in good academic standing with a GPA of 3.0 or higher, and demonstrate financial need. Recipients selected by the Graduate School of Education and the College of Fine Arts (the Committee).

Socrates Lagios Memorial Scholarship

The Lagios Scholarship is awarded to students selected by the UMass Lowell Graduate School of Education Scholarship Committee. The Committee will award at least one scholarship per academic year to an outstanding prospective teacher of secondary school English, who is enrolled in the Graduate School of Education, has demonstrated academic excellence and caring character, and has financial need.

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS

Current and newly accepted GSE students who wish to be considered for a scholarship, should consult the website early in the spring semester where an application form will be found. All applications must be received by April 22nd in order to be considered for a scholarship during the following academic year.
