GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF POSITION: The Occupational Health Advocate will establish and implement an ambitious research and advocacy agenda on occupational health.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Advocate on legislation and proposed regulations. Meet and correspond with legislative and executive officials and staff.
- Work with and when necessary organize coalition partners and individuals affected by occupational health policy.
- Research and write reports, fact sheets, letters, testimony, and comments on proposed rules.
- Develop and maintain media relationships and respond to inquiries. Coordinate with communications division in writing editorial board memoranda, press releases, letters to the editor, and opinion editorials.
- Work closely with the Director on fundraising, including outreach to foundations, written proposals and reports, and electronic solicitations.
- Other duties as assigned.
