

Nitrox Diver Course Description:

Diving with Nitrox or Enriched Air Nitrox offers several advantages for the diver over diving on air with 21% oxygen. These include longer bottom times, reduced surface intervals, and reduced risk of decompression injury. Nitrox dives are recommended, but optional. The \$160 fee includes text and certification fees. SCUBA equipment, nitrox fills, and boat fees are not included.

CPROx1stAED Course Description:

The University of Massachusetts at Lowell SCUBA Diving International Training Program offers the SDI CPROX1st and AED specialty integrating training in CPR, with AED, First Aid, and Oxygen administration for SCUBA diving emergencies. A two year certification card will be awarded after successful completion of this class. This common sense lifesaving program is condition-centered, focusing on action, and takes only 4 hours to learn. This course meets the CPR, First Aid and Oxygen Administration certification requirements for the Rescue Diver course. The \$125 fee includes the text and a waterproof performance slate for your boat or dive bag.

Dry Suit Specialty Course Description:

The North Atlantic is cold, you don't have to be. Extend your dive season. Learn how to select a dry suit and dive with it in comfort. For this special training class Dry Suit's and lunch for the dives on Saturday and Sunday will be provided for a \$8/day by DUI, the leading US dry suit manufacturer. The \$150 course fee includes the text and certification fees. This is lots of fun.
