Minor

In general, a minor consists of 18-24 credits taken in a single subject area with at least 6 credits taken at the 300/400 level. However, some minors require specific coursework. Consult an advisor in the chosen department for specific requirements.

OR

Collateral Requirements*:**

If a student does not declare a minor, he or she must take 18 credits of collateral courses in accordance with the following specifications:

- 1) 12 Credits of collateral electives can be any level.
 2) 6 Credits of collateral electives must be at the 300 level or above.

*****Collateral courses should be chosen from Legal Studies, Psychology, Political Science, or Sociology.**
