

Cultural Studies

The interdisciplinary minor in cultural heritage consists of 18-24 credits of course work. At least 6 credits must be selected from courses that are numbered 300 or above. The courses offered in this program are interdisciplinary in their content and structure and are designed to explore a topic in greater depth and from broader perspectives than is ordinarily possible in other courses. Cultural studies may also be taken as a concentration in the Bachelor of Liberal Arts. Other courses maybe selected in consultation with the advisor or coordinator. Courses emphasize the sources (artistic, literary, philosophical, and historical) of the period studied and focus on the aspirations and achievements of our own civilization.
