

**Literature Concentration
(For Students entering Fall 2006 and after)**

A minimum of 36 credits, appropriately distributed, is required in English department courses. Students may not exceed the maximum of 45 credits of English department courses (not counting College Writing I & II). Thus, at least 75 credits must be earned outside of the major.

- In order to graduate, students must earn a 2.2 grade point average in their English department requirements (see bolded courses below). See reverse side for a list of required courses and electives.
- You must complete 15 credits of literature courses at the 300 level or above. These credits include required courses such as 42.423 Shakespeare I.
- Not counting required courses, such as the surveys of American and English Literature, you may not take more than two courses at the 200 level.
