Methodology in Brief

YouGov interviewed 2287 respondents who were then matched down to a sample of 2000 to produce the final dataset. The respondents were matched to a sampling frame on gender, age, race, and education. The sampling frame is a politically representative "modeled frame" of US adults, based upon the American Community Survey (ACS) public use microdata file, public voter file records, the 2020 Current Population Survey (CPS) Voting and Registration supplements, the 2020 National Election Pool (NEP) exit poll, and the 2020 CES surveys, including demographics and 2020 presidential vote. To generate the likely voters weight, the matched cases were filtered to include only 1688 registered voters and then weighted to the sampling frame using propensity scores. The matched cases and the frame were combined and a logistic regression was estimated for inclusion in the frame. The propensity score function included age, gender, race/ethnicity, years of education, region, 2020 presidential vote choice, and own or rent. The propensity scores were grouped into deciles of the estimated propensity score in the frame and post-stratified according to these deciles. The weights were then weighted to give likely voter profile slightly more weight than their unlikely voter counterparts. Finally, the weights were post-stratified on 2020 presidential votes weight.

UMass Lowell is a public institution and releases surveys as a source of public information.
