## Survey of New Hampshire Democratic Primary Voters

Field Dates: February 4-7, 2020

N=440 New Hampshire Democratic Primary Likely Voters

Adjusted Margin of Error: +/- 6.5%

Margin of error has been adjusted to include for design effects  
resulting from weighting and survey design features

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### Methodology in Brief

This poll was independently funded by the University of Massachusetts Lowell, designed and analyzed by the Center for Public Opinion. Data was collected by YouGov, an online polling organization. Respondents were selected from YouGov and three other online panels. YouGov interviewed 456 eligible respondents who were then matched down to a sample of 440 to produce the final dataset. The respondents were matched to a sampling frame on gender, age, race, and education based on known characteristics of Democratic Party primary voters from the New Hampshire voter file and the 2018 Cooperative Congressional Election Study. The matched cases were weighted to the sampling frame using propensity scores. The matched cases and the frame were combined and a logistic regression was estimated for inclusion in the frame. The propensity score function included age, gender, race/ethnicity, years of education, and region. The propensity scores were grouped into deciles of the estimated propensity score in the frame and post-stratified according to these deciles. The weights were then post-stratified on past primary election behavior, and age x gender stratification of Democratic Primary voters from the New Hampshire voter file to produce the final weight.

UMass Lowell is a public institution and releases surveys as a source of public information. We offer a complete methodology report in adherence with standards of the AAPOR Transparency Initiative, as well an extensive set of crosstabs.
