- Connection to other NMCOG projects



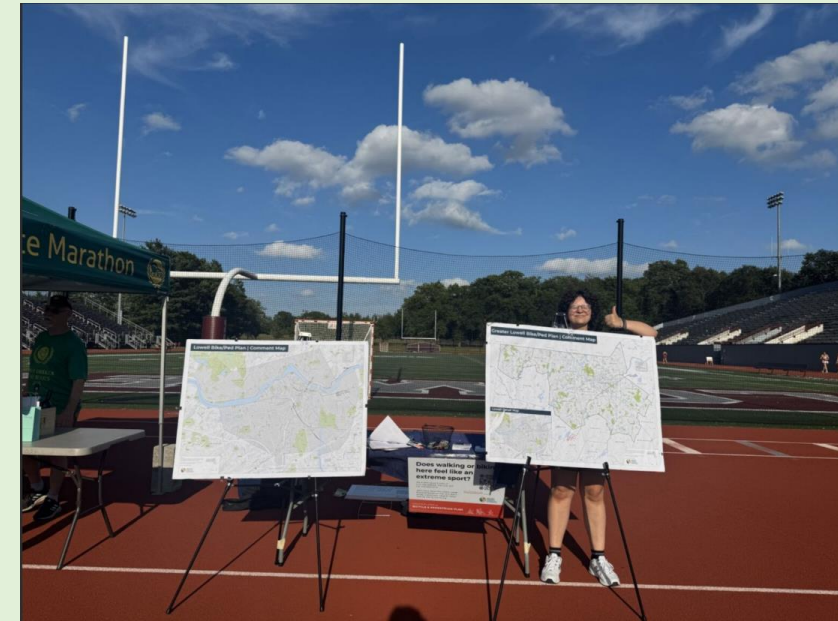

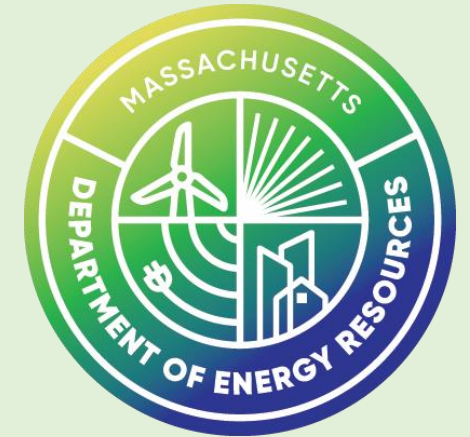
