

#### LIRA 2023 Annual Meeting

During the business portion of the Annual Meeting, we will vote on each of the following items, which have been approved and recommended by the Executive Council:

1. Election of Officers:

Nominating Committee will present the slate of nominees for the coming LIRA Fiscal year—July 1 2023 through June 30, 2024.

2. Change of Bylaws

Change

Newsletter Committee: Produces and publishes a newsletter on a regular basis, at least quarterly, to publicize the regular meetings.

To:

Communications Committee: Manages communications between LIRA Members and the Executive Council. This may be done in a variety of ways:

- 1. Sending regular communications to all members as needed.
- 2. A quarterly newsletter may also be published prior to each session.

The proposed change is a response to the evolution of communications technology and how we communicate with LIRA members.

3. Increase the Membership dues:

Proposal is to increase the LIRA dues as follows:

• Full year membership:

Couples Membership increase from \$200 to \$240 Single Membership increase from \$125 to \$145

Half year membership

Couples Membership increase from \$125 to \$135 Single Membership increase from \$75 to \$85

The dues for LIRA have not changed in over 10 years. Over the last couple of years, we have been experiencing increasing costs to our operating fund, particularly in the area Curriculum offerings. All the proposed increase in dues will be applied to the LIRA operating fund. This fund covers all LIRA activities (Curriculum, Publicity, Hospitality and Administration).

#### **Newsletters on Website**

The newsletter comes out four times a year on the first day of the following months – March, May, September and December. Everyone can read the newsletter online if you have access to a web browser. Those members that do not have email will have a hard copy sent to them automatically. At the time of this writing, the print services at the university are closed so those members that requested a hard copy will not be receiving one.

The on-line newsletter is just like the printed one only better - it's in color! This policy will help us save substantial printing and mailing costs to the university as well as a few trees.

#### **Lowell Canal Tour**

This is a one-and-a-half-hour boat tour through the canal and locks out to the Merrimack River with guided narration by a Park Ranger. We may also stop to visit the Francis Gatehouse en route. The tour is in an opentop motorboat. It is not accessible for wheelchairs but if you can make it down three steps, you should be fine.

Park in the Hamilton Garage off Dutton Street and keep your ticket to be validated at the Park Visitor Center so that it's free. The group will then go together to catch the trolley to Swamp Locks, where we will board the boat. Boats hold 18. Limit 18 with waitlist. No cancellations but waitlist folks can send you a check if you need to drop out. #### **New England Botanic Garden at Tower Hill**

New England Botanic Garden at Tower Hill is a 171-acre botanic garden and arboretum located in Boylston, Massachusetts. The Garden features 18 distinct gardens, preserved woodlands, and miles of walking trails. Experience the wonder of plants at a botanic garden in the heart of New England. The Garden includes conservatories, formal and naturalistic gardens, a Garden Shop, café, and expansive views of the Wachusett Reservoir. NEBG cares for an irreplaceable collection of plants and places sustainability and environmental stewardship at the forefront of its work. Here, wandering is always welcome, and no two visits will ever be the same.

Operated by the Manchester Historic Association, the Millyard Museum is housed in Mill No. 3 at the corner of Commercial and Pleasant Street in the historic Amoskeag Millyard. The Museum's Henry M. Fuller State Theatre Gallery features rotating exhibitions on a variety of topics. The Millyard Museum also features the Discovery Gallery, a multi-purpose space used for school groups, family programs, lectures, temporary exhibits and other activities. #### **Historic Houses Designed by Frank Lloyd Wright**

**Wednesday:** July 19: 11:45 a.m. **Note the time is later than usual.** 

The Currier Museum of Art in Manchester, NH, is the only art museum in the world that owns two Frank Lloyd Wright homes. Accessible by guided tour, they are the only Wright buildings open to the public in New England. Both homes were built in the 1950s when Wright's domestic architecture reshaped American home design. The Usonian Automatic and the Zimmerman House express two equally beautiful visions through their closely related designs and contrasting materials.

Access to the homes is available by tour only. The tours last about two hours. Visitors meet at the museum (150 Ash St., Manchester, NH) and are driven by van to the houses and afterwards back to the museum. Groups are limited to 10 quests.

We have reserved all 10 places on this tour for members of LIRA. The cost of admission is \$35 per person. Admission to the art museum after the tour is included in the price. Please email <a href="mailto:alan-friedman@comcast.net">alan-friedman@comcast.net</a> to reserve your place, first come, first served. If a place is available, I will request that you mail me a check. If the number of people interested exceeds the limit, we can look into scheduling another tour in a subsequent semester.

Visits begin with a brief introduction and close looking together outdoors, followed by self-guided exploration inside the houses with docents present to answer your questions. They have created a handout to enhance your discoveries. The tour of each house concludes with interactive outdoor viewing and time for questions with Currier staff and docents.

Both the Kalil House and the Zimmerman House are historic structures with original floor plans. Although there are accessible spaces in both houses, there are also narrow hallways, staircases, and uneven terrain. The maximum width for mobility devices is 29 inches (73 centimeters). Alnoba's renowned art collection was created to inspire, delight, challenge, and provoke.

Here, art isn't something precious, admired from a distance. It's bold and wild, springing from Alnoba's unique natural landscape and daring you to engage.

The collection includes masterworks by some of the most respected artists of our age, including Andy Goldsworthy, Orly Genger, Jaume Plensa, John Lopez, Allan Houser and Ursula von Rydingsvard.

On your tour, enthusiastic volunteer guides will introduce you to the stories behind the artists and their work. Many of the pieces represent vital themes of social justice and sustainability, challenging us all to go one step further than we thought we could toward a better world.

#### **Guided tour details:**

- Walk starts at 10AM promptly and lasts for roughly 90 minutes. Please make sure you are in the parking lot before then. Guide will meet you there.
- Guests must stay with the guide at all times.
- Please dress appropriately for exploring the outdoors.
- Wear appropriate footwear and bring a bottle of water and sunscreen.
- Be prepared to walk at an easy pace, with some breaks, for the full ninety minutes.

- Alnoba's buildings are closed. Walkers may use the portable restroom in our parking lot.
- No dogs are permitted on the property.
- This is a walking tour only no bicycles.

The tour takes place outdoors, sometimes on uneven terrain, with a roughly 2-mile walk. Hiking shoes and casual attire are recommended. Bring bug spray or sunscreen.

The visit is limited to 15 members per tour, but multiple tours can be done at the same time.
