

Recommended Syllabus Language Regarding Title IX Reporting

Following is language regarding Title IX reporting requirements which Clara I. Orlando, Title IX Coordinator and Director of Equal Opportunity and Outreach; and Deputy Title IX Coordinator Annie Ciaraldi, Associate Dean, Student Affairs and Violence Prevention; jointly recommend that faculty include on their course syllabi. Thank you.

Title IX Reporting Requirements: UMass Lowell is committed to fostering a welcoming, respectful and safe environment. We believe that all the members of the UMass Lowell community are responsible for ensuring that our campus is free from discrimination. In accordance with Title IX, UMass Lowell is required to investigate incidents of sex discrimination that occur on our campus. Faculty who become aware of an incident of sexual violence, including sexual harassment, rape, sexual assault, relationship violence, or stalking, are required to notify UMass Lowell's Title IX Coordinator. The purpose of this disclosure is to inform students of the University's obligations under Title IX and the reporting responsibility of faculty.
