# Faculty Senate Meeting #3 Minutes Monday November 6, 2023 at 3:30 PM • UCC 260

#### 1. A Conversation with Julie Chen

Chancellor Julie Chen came to speak with the Faculty Senate to share campus updates and answer specific questions from our membership. President Kevin Petersen began by asking Senator questions gathered from the previous meeting. We learned that while enrollments are growing, the campus was going to layoff a limited number of staff due to greater budget impacts. In light of the potential reorganization of Carnegie Research 1 classifications, it looks like UML will become R1 in 2025. To build on that momentum, Chancellor Chen noted that the new Graduate School will focus on recruiting, training, and professionalizing research graduate students. She also noted the university's focus on career-connected experiences and her hope to work with Senate to find new interdisciplinary opportunities. Members expressed concern over supporting our struggling students and support for research faculty, and the Chancellor intends to continue engaging Faculty Senate to identify challenges and explore solutions.

- 3.1. **AI Task Force & Interdisciplinary Task Force** (Kevin Petersen). The AI Task Force will have its first meeting this week. We need more volunteers for the Interdisciplinary Task Force.
- 3.2. **Internship Language** (Sal Mazzone). Career Services is working on regulatory language to make it easier for international students to participate in career-connected experiences, when work experience is a required component of a course and an integral part of the curriculum. Kevin Petersen mentioned that Sal and Greg Denon will be invited to UPC and GPAC to further discuss a request for language for course descriptions. Kevin asked those who have experiential learning (internships, coop, whatever it is named in your area) to please bring this back to your departments to find out if there are any key points to be considered.
- 3.3. Research & Development Committee (Thomas Shea) The committee voted to change their name to **Research**, **Production and Performance Committee** to be more

- inclusive of the broad range of faculty work on campus. Thomas Shea invited senators from all departments to meet with him. Approved.
